Trickum Middle School MLA (7th Edition) Citation Guidelines

Format of Works Cited Section

- Type the page number in the upper right-hand corner, one half inch from the top of the page.
- Center the title **Works Cited** an inch from the top. Double space before the first entry.
- Begin each entry flush with the left margin. If the entry runs more than one line, indent additional lines five spaces.
- Double space each entry; also double-space between entries.
- List each entry alphabetically by the author's last name. If there is no author, use the first word of the title (disregard A, An, The).

BOOK (Print)

FORMULA: Last, First Name of Author. Title of Book. City of Publication: Publisher, Copyright date. Print.

EXAMPLE: Milios, Rita. How To Make Good Choices. New York: Rosen Publishers, 2002. Print.

BOOK BY TWO OR MORE PERSONS (Print)

- FORMULA: Last, First Name of Author #1 and First Last Name of author #2. *Title of Book*. City of Publication: Publisher, Copyright date. **Print**.
- EXAMPLE: Barkin, Carol, and Elizabeth James. *How to Write Great School Reports.* New York: Lothrop, Lee, and Shepard Books, 2006. **Print.**

BOOK - NO AUTHOR GIVEN (Print)

FORMULA: *Title of Book*. City of Publication: Publisher, Copyright date. **Print**. EXAMPLE: *Webster's New Geographical Dictionary*. Springfield, Massachusetts: Merriam-Webster, 2005. **Print**.

MAGAZINE ARTICLE (Print)

FORMULA: Last, First Name. "Article Title." *Name of Magazine* Date of Publication: Page(s) number. **Print.** EXAMPLE: Van Biema, David. "Beyond the Sound Barrier." *Time* 3 October 2004: 66-67. **Print.**

NEWSPAPER ARTICLE (Print)

FORMULA: Last, First Name. "Article Title." *Name of Newspaper*. Date of Publication, Section: Page number. **Print**. EXAMPLE: Priest, Dana."Kosovo Plan Calls for 4,000 U.S. Troops." *Washington Post*.14 Feb. 1999, sec. A: 1. **Print**.

ENCYCLOPEDIA ARTICLE (Print)

FORMULA: "Article Title." *Name of Encyclopedia*. Edition Year. Year of Publication. **Print.** EXAMPLE: "Civil War." *World Book Encyclopedia*. 2008 ed. 2008. **Print.**

FORMULA: Last Name, First Name author (if provided). "Title of Article." *Title of the Book (if applicable).* Edition (if known). Year. *Title of Database.* **Web**. Access date.

EXAMPLES:

"Maya Angelou." American Decades. 1998. Biography Resource Center. Web. 15 May 2010.

Mockaitis, Tom. "Terrorism." World Book Student. World Book, 2010. Web. 19 May 2010.

"Republic of Iceland". CultureGrams. 2010. Web. 2, Nov. 2009.

"Volcanoes: Why Do Volcanoes Erupt?" The World Almanac for Kids 2009. 2009. SIRS Discoverer. Web. 15 May 2010.

INTERNET SITES

FORMULA: Last, First Name Author or Editor (if available). "Title of Website Article." (if different from the site). *Title of the Website*. Publisher or Sponsor of Site (If unknown, use n.p). Date of Publication (if unknown, use n.d.) **Web**. Date of Access (day, Month year). <URL>

EXAMPLES:

Anthes, Richard. "Hurricanes and Typhoons." Extreme Weather. Scholastic, Inc. n.d. Web. 1 October 2009.

Amusement Park Physics: Roller Coaster. Annenberg Media. 1997-2010. Web. 17 May 2010.

FORMULA: Author. "Title of the message". E-mail to the author (use this phrase). Date of the message. EXAMPLE: Smith, John. "Holocaust Information Request". E-mail to the author. April 10, 2010.

AUDIOVISUAL MATERIAL (Videos, DVD's etc)

FORMULA: Title. Type of media. City of Publication: Publisher, Copyright date. EXAMPLE: The Scientific Method. Videorecording. Washington, D.C.: National Geographic Society, 1993.

<u>INTERVIEW</u>

FORMULA: Person interviewed. Type of interview. Date of interview. EXAMPLE : Turner, Ted. Telephone interview. 12 September 2010.

IMAGES

FORMULA: Name of Picture. (Image). Access date. <URL>. EXAMPLE: Map of China. (Image). May 20, 2007. < http://www.nationalgeographic.org >.
